Week 6: Sacrifice & the Tabernacle

Psalm 96:9

Thank you for joining us for the Faith & Family Course. We hope you'll join us for our second course, which starts up on November 7th. This 5-week class will explore Jesus and salvation in more depth. A lot of the concepts we looked at in this class will help us understand who Jesus is and what he did in order to save us. In this week's lesson, we learned about the Tabernacle—the place God instructed sacrifices for sin and worship to take place. We talked about what worship looked like in Old Testament times and how although some aspects look very different, the hart of our worship is similar in many ways today.

Discover Family Worship

The following is taken from portions of the book 'Grow at Home: A Beginners Guide to Family Discipleship (pg. 21-22). Check out chapter 2 to learn more about how your family can worship God at home.

God's Word tells us about the duty of parents to lead their children in worship. But this is not just a responsibility— it is a sacred privilege. Leading family worship in your home will bless your children and fill your home with God's grace and peace. As you begin, here are a few practical ideas that may help you make the most of your time of family worship. This section also contains several simple prayers and songs for you and your children to learn together.

Ideas to Make the Most of Your Time

- 1. Find a good children's Bible, such as My First Bible, The Adventure Bible for Young Readers, or The Jesus Storybook Bible.
- 2. Have a daily time for family worship. Develop a routine for your children. It will show your children that this is an important part of the day.
- 3. Balance your time between Scripture memorization, reading Bible stories, prayer and song. This book will help you bring those areas together in a holistic approach to family discipleship.
- 4. Keep the time brief and remember to make the time fun and special.

- 5. Pray with your children every day at meals and before they go to bed at night.
- 6. Let your children ask questions and talk through what they are learning about God and the Bible.
- 7. Ask questions. After reading a Bible passage, ask questions like, "What does this say about God?" or "How does God want me to respond?" Let your children ask questions that they may be thinking about.
